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Mobile Plant & Equipment: Introduction

Common to the use of all mobile plant is the need to:

- Segregate vehicles from pedestrians
- Train staff to use the machines competently
- Make sure the machines are regularly inspected, serviced and maintained; and
- Ensure only trained and authorised personnel are permitted to operate plant on this site.



Mobile Plant & Equipment: Introduction

What to consider?

- **Excavators-** consider exclusion, clearance, visibility and the need for a signaller.
- **Tele handlers-** Consider visibility, static loading, travelling with loads, ground conditions.
- **MEWPs-** Consider confined overhead working, ground conditions, outriggers, guardrails, arresting falls, falling objects, weather, handling materials & nearby hazards.
- **Dumper trucks-** Consider overturning & collision.

Plan route, avoid sudden stops/turns, keep safe distance.

Has the plant/equipment been correctly selected to carry out your assigned task? Do you feel confident making any suggestions to your line manager?

Why is there a need for signallers on site?



Why have separate pedestrian routes?
